Funding opportunities for NSO/NSAs in Europe

Dear friends,

You may recall that in the recent years the European Region has been increasingly trying to promote the use of as well as the accessibility to external sources of funding for Scouting in Europe.

Several efforts have been made to inform NSO/NSAs about European funding opportunities and good results have been achieved in terms of support to regional and national events and projects.

I now have the pleasure to share with you the first of two documents that will hopefully be useful to you and your organisation: "Funding opportunities for NSOs and NSAs in Europe – Issue 1". The document is a working tool for all NSOs and NSAs, aiming to offer comprehensive information about the different funding opportunities available in Europe. It will be added to as further information is available.

It gives an overview of the available funding opportunities, with useful information and direct contacts. Particular attention is given to deadlines and procedures to enable you to be aware of the amount of time and preparation required for an application.

Please note that some of opportunities are offered directly through WOSM (or various entities related to Scouting) while others are external and not limited to Scouting. I warmly suggest to each NSO/NSA to identify which funding opportunity could be more relevant to its aims, needs and projects.

Partnerships Fund (PF)

- Donor: WOSM European Region
- **Aim**: provide financial assistance to associations, through the development of a partnership project
- Who can apply: National Scout Organisations and National Scout Associations of the European Region of WOSM
- Procedure: Application forms can be found on the scout.org/europe website and should be sent by mail or e-mail (europe@scout.org). The application should be based on the needs analysis and discussed with the Committee Contact before submitting the initial application.
- Budget: maximum amount to be provided by the fund is €25,000 per application, representing a
 maximum of 60% of the total project budget
- Deadline: applications may be submitted at any time. There are no application deadlines
- **Example of approved projects/financed actions**: actions focusing on growth, renewal of Youth Programmes or Training Systems. See also scout.org/europe

Small projects of the European Scout Foundation (ESF)

- Donor: European Scout Foundation
- Aim: provide financial support for the development of Scouting in Central and Eastern Europe
- Who can apply: projects should come from a local Scout group or other levels of the NSO and have the approval of the International Commissioner
- Procedure: on line application to be completed on the website
- Budget: amount requested should be between €1,000 and €3,000
- **Deadline**: applications may be submitted at any time. There are no application deadlines
- **Example of approved projects/financed actions**: contribution in educational projects; purchase of material; organisation of events

Eric Frank Trust (EFT)

- Donor: Eric Frank Trust
- **Aim**: to advance education, including development of leadership skills, and to advance young people in life with a view to helping them become more responsible citizens
- Who can apply: any organisation worldwide whose main purpose is the education and development of young people, with priority given to NSOs/NSAs
- **Procedure**: projects must be submitted electronically to "The Administrator of the Eric Frank Trust Stella Simpson" at stella@waltonfirs.co.uk. There is a standard cover page, but no application form. No application from a Scout organisation will be considered unless it has the written support of the World Scout Bureau, Central and/or Regional office.
- **Budget**: no more than £30.000 will be made available to any one project.
- **Deadline**: applications may be submitted at any time. There are no application deadline
- **Example of approved projects/financed actions**: activities promoting leadership development in young people

Youth in Action Programme of the European Commission (YiA)

- Donor: European Union
- Aim: is the Programme that the European Union has set up for young people and youth organisations. It has been designed to support activities and events that aim to inspire and foster a sense of active European citizenship, solidarity and tolerance among young Europeans and to involve them in shaping the Union's future. It promotes mobility within and beyond the EU borders, non-formal education and intercultural dialogue
- Who can apply: all the programme actions foreseen are eligible for NSOs/NSAs in all the so called "Programme Countries" meaning EU Member States + Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Switzerland, Croatia, Turkey ; only few actions are available for "Neighbouring partner countries", meaning Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, FYRoM, Montenegro, Serbia and Israel. Eligible participants are young people aged between 13 and 30 years old or adults active in youth work or youth organisations legally resident in one of the Programme or Neighbouring Partner Countries. For all YiA Projects there are different age limits and also different numbers of eligible participants.
- Procedure: Depending on the programme action, the selection process is initiated in one of the following ways: permanent (or on-going) call for proposals and specific calls for proposals. Application forms of each call for proposal are available on the websites of each National agency of the Youth in Action programme. Please note that for the majority of the actions require a partnership among organisations from different countries meaning that the activities have to be international
- **Budget**: each action has different funding rules but generally the support is offered in terms of travel, accommodation and activity costs through percentages of actual costs, lump sums and scale of unit costs. Please note that in all the programme actions of the YiA co-funding is required: the support does not finance in any case the 100 % of the costs
- Deadline: ad hoc deadlines for specific calls for proposal; 5 deadlines per year for permanent call for proposals (01-02 / 01-04 / 01- 06 / 01-09 / 01-11)
- **Example of approved projects/financed actions**: youth exchanges, youth initiatives, youth democracy projects, European voluntary service, training and networking activities, meetings with young people and those responsible for youth policy. In particular NSOs/NSAs should take into consideration Action 1.2 "Youth Initiatives" and Action 5.1 "Meeting of Young People and those responsible for youth policy" because are the few actions that could be developed at national level without the need of international partners

European Youth Foundation of the Council of Europe (EYF)

- Donor: Council of Europe
- **Aim**: provide financial support for European youth activities. Its purpose is to encourage co-operation among young people in Europe by providing financial support to European youth activities which serve the promotion of peace, understanding and co-operation in a spirit of respect for the Council of Europe's fundamental values such as human rights, democracy, tolerance and solidarity
- Who can apply: youth organisations such as NSOs/NSAs from countries that are Member States of the Council of Europe. Even if the participants in the projects are youth leaders, at least 75% of them must be under the age of 30.
- **Procedure**: youth organisations must be registered online in the EYF database before being able to submit an application; in order to apply an organisation has to fill in an on line application. Please note that for the majority of the actions require a partnership among organisations from different countries meaning that the activities have to be international
- Budget: EYF cannot cover the full cost of the project. Its contribution may not exceed two-thirds of the total cost of a project. Average grant for Category A is 15,000 €; Category B is 5,000€
- Deadline: Category A and B two deadlines per year: 01/04 01/10. There are no fixed deadlines for the submission of Category D projects however, the project application should reach the EYF Secretariat at least 3 months before the beginning of the activity

- Example of approved projects/financed actions: there are 3 categories of grants to which organisations can apply to: A International youth meetings; B Youth activities other than meetings; D pilot projects. In particular NSOs/NSAs should take into consideration Category D Pilot Projects because is the only option to develop projects at national level without the need of international partners

Other opportunities

- Foundations: across Europe several foundations provide funding for youth projects. Some of them are active at European/international level but the majority of them are based and operate at national level. We can't provide, for obvious reasons, an exhaustive list of all the foundations active in the youth field. Therefore NSO/NSAs interested to work with foundations should first look for national databases that are normally available on line. One interesting database is offered by the European Foundation Centre (EFC) at www.efc.be. The EFC is an international association of foundations and corporate funders and those foundations specifically works on children and youth can be found at: www.efc.be/Networking/InterestGroupsAndFora/ChildrenYouth/Pages/EuropeanChildrenandYouthGro up%28Default%29.aspx
- Corporate sector: more and more corporate companies are nowadays developing Corporate Social Responsible schemes, providing either funding, services or other kinds of support to civil society organisations.
