- give participants the chance to share best practises and to network for the success of future projects

Environment – Learn and share more about climate change, biodiversity and recycling Advocacy - Learn about how you can raise awareness about the environment and take action on environmental issues in your community

Communication – Strengthen your communication skills in a cross cultural setting

The WAGGGS' Leadership Development Programme (WLDP)

modules and educational approach will be used to deliver the programme. Participants will be encouraged to develop and deliver a project that will address environmental issues in their Member Organization or community.

Who can apply?

Participants should

- be young women between 18–25 years old, current leaders
- be passionate about leadership
- be passionate about environmental issues, and want to raise awareness about them to make a difference in their community, country and the wider world
- have an understanding of and be able to communicate in English as the seminar will be conducted in English

Participants will learn about WAGGGS' initiatives and partnerships, as well as projects undertaken by Member Organizations in different WAGGGS Regions. There will be an opportunity to link up virtually with participants attending the partner seminar at Sangam World Centre in India being held simultaneously. Participants will gain an understanding of global environmental problems from a different perspective.

- Participants are expected to arrive by 18.00 on 13 March 2012. Seminar officially opens on 14 March 2012 and closes on 19 March 2012. Departures scheduled on 20 March 2012.
