Since the last meeting of the European Scout Committee

### • AC 5.1.1 - IN PROGRESS

Encourage NSOs/NSAs to give a new impetus to the Euro-Arab and Europe-Eurasia meetings and establish priority themes relevant to the needs of NSOs/NSAs

### **Progress:**

- Successful Europe Eurasia Meeting 25-27 November 2011 Prague. 51 participants attending. Good results with new partnerships and renewal of existing ones
- Good attendance planned for the Partnerships event from the Eurasia side (15-18 March 2012)
- Impetus given at the German Speaking Conference, with interest from different organisations (Austria, Hungary) on working with Arab NSOs. (25-26 February).
- o Start of the preparation with the Italian federation
- $\circ\,$  Tailored support to AGESCI: Very successful and interesting event on Arab revolution and the role of Scouting in democracy
- Euro arab meeting: follow-up-networking with the participants facilitated by a working group member.

 The European Region is now represented in the Advisory Council of the Council of Europe by Sandu Coica, from Moldova; in cooperation with Eurasia Region. We have just renewed the mandate for two years (2012-2013).

### **Progress:**

- Tools are to be soon distributed. Some delays were experienced with the finalisation.
- The final report was successfully submitted to the European commission on 31 January 2012
- A workshop to prepare the next Europe Africa project (3.2) was hold in Bruxelles on 6-7 February 2012, with the participation of CNE, CNGEI, Scouts and Guides of Sweden, WOSM ARO and former member of UNGUVU project

 A new member of staff has been recruited to assist on the project for 12 months, Benjamin Thurotte has started to work on January 16.

 We got successful funding (22 000 euros) from YiA for the Partnerships event, in Paris, via the application submitted by SGDF. We are expecting around 70 participants, from Europe and other regions.
