Report of the independent auditor on the financial statements

As independent auditor and in accordance with your instructions, we have audited the accompanying financial statements of Fund for European Scouting (FES) Allocation, which comprise the balance sheet, statement of operations and notes for the year 2010/2011 ended 30 September 2011.

Responsibility of the management

The Management is responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the accounting principles as described in the notes to the financial statements. This responsibility includes designing, implementing and maintaining an internal control system relevant to the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. The Management is further responsible for selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

Auditor's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Swiss Auditing Standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS OF 30 SEPTEMBER 2011

Note 1 - General

The World Scout Bureau - Europe Region is a regional branch of the World Scout Bureau, Geneva, in conformity with Article XVI (2) of the constitution and by-laws of the World Organization of the Scout Movement. It is a not-for-profit organization.

The purpose of the Fund for European Scouting (FES) Allocation, a special purpose entity, is to assist the development and growth of the Scout Movement in Europe by financing approved projects within the terms of the McIntosh settlement. The income from this Fund is an integral part of the World Scout Bureau - Europe Region based in Geneva.

Note 2 - Fund for European Scouting (McIntosh beguest)

The Fund for European Scouting, managed by JP Morgan Chase Guaranty Trust Company of New York, has a total market value of USD 22.8m as of 30 September 2011 (2010: USD 24.6m).

The amount received each year by the European Scout Region corresponds to 5% of the average market value of the Fund during the previous three years.

Note 3 - Summary of significant accounting policies

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as follows:

3.1. General principles

The Fund for European Scouting (FES) Allocation maintains its books and records in US Dollars ("USD").

3.2. Foreign currency conversion

Revenue and expenses in currencies other than the USD are converted in USD at the exchange rate prevailing at the beginning of the month of the transaction.

Year-end balances in other currencies are converted at the prevailing rates of exchange at balance sheet date.

3.3. Cash

The Fund for European Scouting (FES) Allocation considers cash on hand, amounts due from banks and short-term deposits to be cash.

3.4. Accounts receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at nominal value, less a provision for doubtful receivables.

Note 3 - Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

3.5. Accounts payable

Accounts payable are recorded at nominal value.

3.6. Accrued liabilities

Accrued liabilities correspond to costs incurred by the Fund for European Scouting (FES) Allocation for which no invoices have been received at year-end. These costs are recorded based on management's best estimate of future cash outflows or based on invoices received subsequent to the year-end.

3.7. Accrued liabilities Partnership Fund

The accrued liabilities for the Partnership Fund concerns signed agreements between the WSB European Regional Office and National Scout Associations / National Scout Organizations and are due for payment in the next fiscal years. The purpose of the Partnership Fund is to provide financial support for projects proposed by National Scout Associations / National Scout Organisations.

3.8. Income and Expense Recognition

Income and Expenses are recognized on the accrual basis and registered in the period to which they relate.

Note 4 - European Investment Fund (EIF)

Based on a decision of the European Scout Committee, the World Scout Bureau and the European Scout Foundation from 11 December 2010 the European Investment Fund (EIF) was created. The assets of the fund are managed by the European Scout Foundation and are to be invested for good benefit of the European Scouting.

Following the creation of the European Investment Fund (EIF), cash and securities were transferred to the accounts of the European Regional Office for further transfer to the EIF.

Note 5 - Forward contracts

Two forward contracts of CHF 900'000 and EUR 430'000 with maturity date on 20 October 2010 have been sold with a realized exchange gain of USD 227'907.

There is no open forward contract as at 30.09.2011.
