2. Progress in implementing Objectives, Actions and achieving KPIs

Since the last meeting of the European Scout Committee

AC 1.1.3 – IN PROGRESS

Encourage NSOs/NSAs to review role descriptions for adult volunteers in Scouting to ensure that the language used is recognisable by potential volunteers

Progress:

o The group contacted some NSOs and collected information on role descriptions.

AC 1.1.4 – IN PROGRESS

Encourage NSOs/NSAs to ensure that training undertaken as an adult volunteer in Scouting is seen as having value outside of Scouting

 Addressed by some of the ROLIS partners through their collaboration with governmental and public entities.

 Some results were achieved through the work of the EYV 2011 Alliance Working Group on Legal Framework. It was also a part of questionnaire sent to the NSOs in Autumn, but the responses were very limited in numbers.
