Background

In the framework of the project "Scouting 3.0: developing e-learning for youth organisations", the European Scout Region is pleased to invite you to the International Workshop which will be held on 07 June and 08 June 2014 in Brussels, Belgium. This event will be an integral part of the closing meeting of the 8 NSO/NSAs partners in the project and enable all European NSOs to understand how they can engage and benefit from ScoutingLinks. This project is financed by the Youth in Action Programme of the European Commission.

Participants will be registered in the system and enrolled in a course. Throughout the meeting they will be requested to develop a library referring to the links that can support the implementation of e-Learning.

The meeting will take place in the residential youth centre De Waterman, in Brussels. The venue offers rooms for accommodation and is equipped with all the necessary facilities to run the event. Number of participants

We will accept up to two participants from an association. Priority will be given to have the largest number of different countries represented. Please note that the meeting has a limited number of places available for participation therefore registration will follow the principle "first come, first served" considering that a maximum of 20 participants are possible (to be accommodated in twin rooms).

Participation fee

There is no participation fee for the event.

Full programme is covered (including accommodation, meals, and event materials) from the dinner of 06 June to lunch on 08 June 2014. Accommodation is in twin rooms.

No travel costs to the venue are supported. That should be arranged by the participating organisations themselves. Bank details for paying the participation fee will be provided to participants upon registration.

Travel arrangements

Once participants have been approved, they will receive all the travel information and a travel form. After that they should make their own travel arrangements. The transport from the airports will NOT be provided by the Region.

The WOSM - European Region does not cover participants during the event neither during the travel to or from the venue. Please note that this is the exclusive responsibility of the national association to check and be sure that the participants are covered by insurance (illness, accidents, repatriation etc.)
