- Able to communicate well in English
- + Professionals or volunteers above 30 years old -> limited amount of places available;

The participants are expected to work during the training on a concrete plan, project or activity that they could implement in their NSO or NSA.

Participation fees

The event is designed to accept up to 36 participants from 18 NSOs (2 participants by sending NSOs) supported under the Council of Europe – European Youth Foundation.

About 15 additional participants can be accepted providing the sending NSO is paying the full amount of the training (first in – first served will be applied).

Applications will be thoroughly reviewed and evaluated. Priority will be given to NSOs and young people

having experience in the relevant fields and willing to review and open the non-formal educational programmes to young people from minorities. Particular attention will be given to the diversity of the group of participants.

Participants under the CoE – EYF €75.00 (Euros)

The fee covers all accommodation and meals from the evening of TUESDAY, 2 SEPTEMBER 2014 to breakfast on SUNDAY, 7 SEPTEMBER 2014. The fee covers transport from the Railway Station Brno, Czech Republic, to the venue and back. It also covers all programme materials and documentation. The travel costs from the country of residence to Brno, Czech Republic, and return will be reimbursed up to 70%, on the basis of agreed travel costs between the organisation and the organiser of the event.

Participants not under the CoE - EYF €215.00 (Euros)

The fee covers all accommodation and meals from the evening of TUESDAY, 2 SEPTEMBER 2014 to breakfast on SUNDAY, 7 SEPTEMBER 2014. The fee covers transport from the Railway Station Brno, Czech Republic, to the venue and back. It also covers all programme materials and documentation. The fee does not cover travel costs to BRNO, Czech Republic, but covers transport from / to the Railway Station Brno to the venue and back.

- Generated common understanding about the advantages of inclusion of Roma, both for scouts and the communities
- · Experiences of inclusion of Roma, were shared, both by facilitators and participants
- A concrete action, to be implemented within one year, was developed by each participant.
