Categories and Fees

Delegates

Members of National Scout Parliamentary Associations or groups in a legislative body of country, **one current Parliamentary Delegate from <u>each country</u> will be guests of the Swedish Scout Parliamentary Association.** Additional delegates will be applied the registration fee of <u>USD 450 per</u> <u>person</u>. Invitation for the delegate includes all the items indicated in the Registration Fee section. Please note that this does not include accommodation nor the transport from your country to your hotel.

Young leader

A young leader is a representative of young leaders of your country, at the age of 18-25. **One young leader from** <u>each country</u> will be guests of the Swedish Scout Parliamentary Association. Any additional young leaders will be applied the registration fee of USD 450 per person.

Observers and Additional Delegates

Observers are representatives of a National Scout Organization, accompanying persons or any other participants invited by Executive Committee of the World Scout Parliamentary Union.

Additional personnel

Any additional personnel you wish to include in the meeting, as for example security or embassy personnel or interpreters.

Registration Fee

One current Parliamentary Delegate and one young leader from <u>each country</u> will be invited by Swedish Scout Parliamentary Association as guests free of charge. Additional delegates, observers or personnel can be registered with registration fee of <u>USD 450 per person</u>. The fee includes:

- Meals
- Programme included in the agenda

Please note that accommodations, transports and interpreters are not included in the fee.

We are happy to arrange your accommodation for you with special rates within walking distance from the parliamentary building. The hotels we offer are:

<u>Hotel Gamla Stan, Single room at **USD 95/room/night**.</u> Hotel Gamla Stan is a two star hotel within nine minutes' walk to the Parliamentary building, and 19 minutes' walk to Stockholm Central Station. The single rooms do have shared bathrooms, but are nice and clean in a building which dates back to the 17th century.

<u>Hotel Nordic C, Single room at **USD 220/room/night**</u>. Nordic C is a four-star hotel located just across the street from Stockholm Central Station and 12 minutes' walk to the Parliamentary building. The rooms are decorated in Scandinavian modern style with hardwood floors and contemporary artwork.

<u>First Hotel Reisen, Superior room at **USD 310/room/night**</u>. First Hotel Reisen is a four-star hotel located in Old Town, just five minutes' walk to the Swedish Parliament and 17 minutes' walk from Stockholm Central Station. The rooms offers stunning views of Stockholm's waterfront in classically refined setting.

Breakfast buffet and WiFi is included in all the prices. Additional hotel expenses, such as laundry, telephone and private meals will be at the expense of each participant. All the room prices is for single person.

Scouterna - the Swedish national scout organisation

On January 1 2013, scouts in Sweden entered a new organisation. The new organisation is called The Guides and Scouts of Sweden (in Swedish: Scouterna) and includes all scouts in Sweden, currently 65 700.

A prominent feature of Swedish Scouting is the long tradition of boys and girls working together. As early as 1960 the Boy Scout Association and the Girl Guide Association were united in one organisation. The terms Boy Scout and Girl Guide are no longer in use in Sweden. In Swedish, both girls and boys are called "Scouts" (the same word as in English).

The Motto in Swedish is: "Var Redo! Alltid Redo!" ("Be prepared! Always prepared!")
