WHAT'S AN AGORA?

An Agora is an educational tool that uses the Scout Method to reach the educational objectives for the Rover age section and that has a special emphasis on youth empowerment.

What makes an Agora so special is that it is an event run "for Rovers, by Rovers". Thus, the event looks at issues that are of importance and relevant to young people in our society today.

An Agora aims to be a meeting place in which dreams, feelings, concerns, experiences, ideas and paths come together, are connected and shared; a crossroads that would be a source of inspiration and energy. It is a place where the fundamentals of Scouting are present in a way that is attractive to young people today. It is a place for debate and sharing as well as teaching and learning one from another. And most importantly, an Agora is about getting new motivation and direction to one's path as a Rover.

Each event focuses on a major theme, on which the programme is built upon.

Dates and Venue

The 10th Agora will be organised at **Scoutcentrum Kruithius**, Delft, The Netherlands, between **19 and 23 April 2017**.

PARTICIPANTS AND PLANNING TEAM

Participant Profile and NSO/A Requirements

Participants should:

- Be members of the last age section in their NSO/A (aged 16-24) who are enthusiastic, motivated, open to new ideas and willing to share their own experiences.
- Be willing to talk about personal experiences and have a knowledge of how Rovers operate in their own countries.
- Have a minimum standard of English which allows them to understand and communicate well during the event.
- Not have too much prior experience in adult roles within their NSO/As or in international work.

NSO/As are encouraged to:

- Ensure that their delegations are as diverse as possible (gender, geographical or economic background).
- Provide selected participants with sufficient knowledge of the Rover Programme in their own country.
- Consider the best ways in which the experience accumulated during the event could be used for the benefit of the programme for the Rover section in the country. This would, ideally, be shared with participants before their participation.

Terminology

Aware that each National Scout Association has different names for the different age sections; for this event, we will define Rovers as being members of the last age section (aged 16-24). Participation fee

The participation fee is €175. The fee covers all accommodation and meals from the evening of Wednesday, 19 April to lunch on Sunday, 23 April, all the materials for the sessions and the social programme. The fee does not cover travel costs. Bank connections and details for paying the event participation fee will be reported to all participants by the Agora acceptance letter.
